This time of year makes us think about summer and the ordinary life in the church. We have just celebrated the feast of Pentecost which should remind us of the Holy Spirit.

In whose care did Jesus place the Catholic Church?

Jesus placed the Catholic Church in the care of the Holy Spirit. How long will the Holy Spirit remain with the Church? The Holy Spirit will remain with the Church until the end of time.

Questioning Mind

On what day did the Holy Spirit come down upon the Apostles? The Holy Spirit came down upon the Apostles ten days after the Ascension of Jesus; which is called Pentecost. Pentecost means fifty and is the fiftieth day after Easter.

Will the Holy Spirit abide with the Church forever?

The Holy Spirit will abide with the Church forever, and guide it in the way of holiness and truth. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, the Church is enabled to enlighten, strengthen, comfort, and sanctify humans.

More Advanced Person of Faith

Why did Jesus send the Holy Spirit?

Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to sanctify His Church, to enlighten and strengthen the Apostles, and to enable them to preach the Gospel. One of the four marks of the Church is holiness. The Holy Spirit enables the Church to be holy by conferring upon the Church and its members the graces which Jesus earned by His death. The Holy Spirit gave the Apostles understanding of all that Jesus had said and done. The Holy Spirit also strengthened the Apostles by giving them courage to meet every danger while carrying out their apostolic mission. Similarly, He also gives us strength through the sacrament of Confirmation.

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy



What is the Chaplet of Divine Mercy?

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is a special devotional prayer said

by Catholics all over the world. Like the rosary, it is said using the rosary beads to help keep track of the prayers. Jesus revealed the message of Diving Mercy to a Polish nun named Sister Faustina beginning in 1931. Sr. Faustina was later canonized a saint in April of 2000. If you've seen the image of Jesus with rays pouring forth from his heart with his hands outstretched, then you've seen the image of the Divine Mercy. At the bottom of this image are the words, "Jesus I Trust in You."

How to recite the Chaplet of Divine Mercy:

On the three beads above the crucifix say: One Our Father, One Hail Mary and the Apostles' Creed.

On the Our Father beads before each decade say:

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On the ten Hail Mary beads of each Decade say:

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

After five decades repeat three times:

Holy God, Holy Might One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Optional concluding prayer say:

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

The three o'clock hour (the hour Christ died) is known as the hour of divine mercy. Many people say this prayer during that hour but it can be said any time. Great mercy and graces can come to those who pray this prayer. Why not try it and see how it changes your life.
